Does someone:

- Embarrass you with bad names or put-downs?
- Look at you or act in ways that scare you?
- Control what you do, who you see or talk to, or where you go?
- Stop you from seeing or talking to friends or family?
- Take your money or social security, make you ask for money, or refuse to give you money?
- Make all the decisions?
- Tell you you're a bad parent or threaten to take away your children?
- Act like the abuse is no big deal, it's your fault, or even deny doing it?
- Destroy your property or threaten to kill your pets?
- Intimidate you with guns, knives, or other weapons?
- Shove you, slap or hit you?
- Force you to drop charges?
- Threaten to commit suicide?
- Force you into any sexual act?
- Threaten to kill you?

What is a Victim Advocate? What can they do for me?

Advocates support victims of domestic violence. Working closely with law enforcement and social work staff, they help to ensure all available resources are provided to victims. Victim Advocates also respond to Sexual Assault.

Where can I get help or talk to someone right now?

Call the Victim Advocate Hotline anytime if you are a victim of abuse or just want answers to help you with your situation. We will try to answer your questions whether you give your name and situation or not.

Where can you find Victim Advocates?

The Family Advocacy Program has numerous victim advocates located on and off Fort Bragg for your convenience. Victim Advocates are available anytime, 24 hours/day and are willing and able to assist you. Please call or stop by the Army Community Service, Family Advocacy Program to find the one nearest you.

ACS Victim Advocacy services include:

- Providing individuals information on their rights as survivors of domestic violence.
- Helping victims locate shelters and other safe housing.
- Establishing immediate and long term safety plans.
- Accompanying victims to court, meetings with legal services, law enforcement and/or command, emergency room visits, and doctor appointments.
- Representing victims at the Case Review Committee meetings.
- Help in obtaining Military Protective Orders (MPO).
- Supporting victims, and empowering them to make and carry out decisions to improve their quality of life.
- Providing support to victims of sexual assault.



What is Sexual Assault?

Sexual assault is defined as intentional sexual contact, characterized by use of force, physical threat, abuse of authority, or when the victim does not or cannot consent.
